Venezuelan Cattleya Species in the Habitat *Michael Sinn*

Born in Venezuela to German parents, Michael Sinn was twelve years old when he became fascinated with orchids. He took over the care and culture of his mother's backyard collection of over 120 plants, primarily Cattleyas and Oncidiums. When he purchased his own first orchid, a blooming *V. sanderiana*, he knew he'd been bitten by orchid fever. Growing up, Michael hiked the jungles of South America whenever he could in search of Cattleyas in their natural habitats.

Following graduation from Universidad Metropilitana in Caracas where he received a degree in civil engineering, Michael worked for four years in the Venezuelan Amazon State as a contractor. The work afforded him the opportunity to observe the habitat of the *C. violacea*. Fired by what he believed was an urgent need for conservation of the precious plants, he spent personal time teaching local people how to pollinate the orchids, impressing upon them the need to let the plants remain in their natural habitat.

Orchid fever never left Michael. His deep commitment to conservation and preservation instinctively drew him toward the breeding Cattleyas and Laelias, eventually to

starting his own nursery. In 2003, Michael brought his family to Florida and worked to make the next phase of his dream come true. He created and continues to grow and develop his own nursery business – Canaima Orchids.

For the past three decades, Michael has made numerous excursions to Brazil, Colombia

and Venezuela to observe Cattleya habitats. Witnessing their dwindling numbers has only strengthened his resolve and endeavor to produce the finest cultivars of Cattleya species possible. His vision remains constant: to conserve native species by creating from seed-raised populations superior plants featuring rare and unusual color forms that were only a dream a generation ago. Michael Sinn has succeeded.

Canaima Orchids takes pride in its long list of international awards, including those from the United States, Japan and South America, that validate its breeding stock as being of the finest quality. Canaima's superior seedlings and divisions are eagerly sought by orchid connoisseurs the world over. The nursery has been recently relocated to Carpinteria, CA. Speaker's Choice

Harry Phillips, our April speaker, was faced with an impossible task—to select just one "favorite orchid" for his Speaker's Choice. He narrowed it down to maybe 10, then 6. He finally settled on the Renanthera citrina grown by Peter Lin, since it is rarely seen, and is a beautifully-grown example. Peter grows it in his greenhouse.

Renanthera citrina grows in Vietnam and southcentral China. It occurs in mixed and coniferous forests that grow on limestone outcroppings near ridge

tops. It is found at elevations from 2100-2900 ft. At this latitude, it may encounter rather cool winter temperatures. Charles Baker (cited in <u>Orchidwiz</u>) gives the probable temperature extremes of 25–95 deg. F. In winter, it is quite dry, however, which would help the plant survive the cold.

Editor's Potting Bench

If you have not already made your reservation for Orchid Digest Speakers' Day, this is an event that you should not miss! We had enough SCOSS members attend last year to fill a table at the dinner. Maybe this year we can fill two tables! I think that everyone who went last year enjoyed it thoroughly. Don't delay— because of construction at the Huntington Library and Botanical Gardens, the event will be held in a room about 1/3 the size that we have had in the past. When all the seats are filled, no more reservations will be taken. Orchid Digest has added an online reservation option, so it is easy... no need to search for your checkbook or a stamp.

Please note that the Santa Barbara Orchid Fair at the Earl Warren Showgrounds will NOT be held this year. However, both Santa Barbara Orchid Estate and Cal-Orchid will be having open houses the weekend of July 12-14. There will be plenty of good shopping at both nurseries. The wonderful barbecue (with lots of excellent guacamole!) will be held at Cal-Orchid as usual.

As the days lengthen and become warmer, nearly all of the orchids are in active growth, with lots of young, vigorous roots making an appearance. I am in heavy repotting mode. One observation that I have made is that about two years ago, the quality of the coconut chips seems to have dropped (even those that are not highly compressed). I am seeing much more degradation in this medium than I have seen in the past, in just a short time. If you have been using it, take a look at your plants, repot if necessary. I am switching back to bark (or tree-fern fiber cubes in some cases) for Cattleya tribe

plants and other things that need to dry out. Even with large amounts of Diatomite (which is now unavailable anyway) they're just staying too wet. and not airy enough. Cymbidiums, on the other hand, seem to like

the stuff. Just keep in mind the objectives that you have for each type of orchid, and be ready to adjust

how you achieve them when circumstances change.

I am finding that many plants are blooming about a month later than they did last year, but when they do, they are blooming profusely. It is exciting to see the first bloom on plants that I have acquired over the last year, but also so very rewarding to see my "old friends" show me that they still like me.

I bought Arpophyllym giganteum at the Species auction about 5 years ago. Some leaves had been sunburned, which did not harm the plant, but for a couple of years they didn't look so nice. In time, those old leaves fell off, the new ones look great, and the plant blooms faithfully for me every year. I hope I can bring it for show-and-tell, but the flowers tend to not last long, and with the meeting being a week later, it might not make it, so I share it here. This genus is an excellent outdoor grower—Arpophyllum alpinum will put on its show in the fall.

Polystachya paniculata is another faithful bloomer for me. The inflorescence has a dramatic contrast

between the tiny, bright orange flowers and the bright green panicle to which they are attached. This African orchid needs a greenhouse.

Another thrill for me was the reblooming of Masdevallia trochilus, which I obtained from Nick Braemer about a year and a half ago. (Thanks, Nick!). It first bloomed for me last August. After the flower faded, the inflorescence remained, and it just produced another, even better (more photogenic), flower (with yet another one beginning to develop). I don't cut spikes until they start to wither, because I would certainly not want to mss out on sequential bloomers like this one. The flower is so three-dimensional that one photo angle is not sufficient to describe it.—so you get two.
