Water Quality and Fertilizer for Orchid Culture

Kay Klausing

Our Vice President, Nick Braemer, has known Kay Klausing for many years. Here are Nick's comments on this program.

"Our February speaker is Kay Klausing from San Diego. He is a molecular biologist with a PhD in Molecular Genetics from the University of Konstanz. He presently works in the biotech firm Illumina in San Diego.

He has been growing orchids for over thirty years with the emphasis on the Cattleya alli-

ance. He is a prominent member of the San Diego Orchid society and I have admired his beautiful Cattleyas on numerous occasions. He probably grows rupiculous Laelias better than anyone I know.



His talk will concentrate on water quality and fertilizer. He will talk about the importance of pure water and proper fertilization in orchid culture. He will show ways to make pure water and discuss the system choices. He will discuss the literature on the need of fertilizer for optimal orchid culture and will give some advice."

Speaker's Choice

.January speaker Tom Biggart selected a beautiful specimen of Angraecum distichum, grown by Peter Lin. Peter grows his plant in a greenhouse. He also uses reverse-osmosis water.

Angraecum distichum grows over a wide area in equatorial west Africa. According to Charles Baker (in <u>Orchidwiz</u>) it is found in the coastal countries of Guinea and Sierra Leone eastward through Liberia, Ivory Coast, Ghana, Nigeria, Cameroon, then southward to Angola.

Distribution extends eastward through the interior to western Uganda.

All reported data indicate that it grows from sea level to no more than 650 ft. (200m). It is clear that this species requires warmth and humidity to thrive.

Editor's Potting Bench

We are heading into the peak orchid-acquiring season, both shows and auctions. There are SOOO many opportunities to expand your collection! I'd like to call your attention to a few of them, that are right in our own backyard. The NHOS Orchid Expo at the Westminster mall February 13-15, will bring several of our favorite vendors to this convenient location just up the road. I counted 15 vendors on the website. Remember, Southern California Orchid Species Society will be putting in a display. (Setup on Thursday, February 12.) We need your help and plants if possible.

I am planning on taking in the San Francisco Pacific Orchid Exposition the weekend of Feb. 20-22. That one is "species heaven". If you aren't already planning on it this year, put it on your "bucket list" for the future. There are quite a few vendors who can be found there and no place else in California, and displays by some truly fantastic species growers who live in the SF Bay area.

Note that the South Bay Orchid Society Show, which had been scheduled for February 21-22 has been cancelled.

In addition to the NHOS show, there are auctions! February kicks off with San Diego Cymbidium Society on Feb. 7, then Cool Growing Orchid Society (which replaces OCBCSA) on Feb. 11, and Newport Harbor Orchid Society on Feb. 17. Whew! And then there's a busy March as well. More on that next month.

All those orchids that you will probably acquire, in addition to the ones that you already have, are likely to need repotting very soon. Yamada Co., 706 W. Gardena Blvd., Gardena, will be having a sale on all orchid supplies for the

entire month of February. It is really easy to get to from essentially all of Orange County (it's right where the 91 Freeway ends) and they have all the stuff you need (including several sizes of Perlite and of Orchiata bark, and also coconut husk chunks) Wear your badge or otherwise identify yourself as an SCOSS member, so that they know that they are getting business from the Orange County area.

What passes for winter in southern California is nearly over, and this one has been particularly mild. Days are becoming noticeably longer. The long-

range weather forecast, although certainly subject to change, shows nights mostly staying above 50 degrees, at least in the coastal area, with mild days. The orchids are starting to respond. Don't just follow the calendar in deciding when... look at your plants. Especially if you were thinking of mounting a plant, the roots on that L. anceps say "NOW, last week would have been better." Certainly, when you see root growth like that (and I am seeing "action" on quite a few Cattleya-tribe orchids) it is time to get to work. Many plants will produce roots over a fairly long time and therefore be forgiving of exactly when you pot, but timing for mounting is more critical. Only those new, rapidly growing roots will attach to a mount. And it is pretty much impossible to avoid damaging some tender little root tips—what saves you is the new roots that grow after you have handled the plant.

Of course, I'm anxiously watching the ones in bloom, hoping that they'll hold for two more weeks, for the NHOS show. And hoping that the ones that look very

pregnant decide to open by then (and not the week after) There are a few that just don't lend themselves to display because they are tiny. The flowers of this Scaphosepalum microdactylum are only about 1/8". They appear sequentially, so at any one time it's not an impressive display. But they are very cute in close-up, and it is fun to discover plants like this which, if you don't look closely, you might miss. This grows outside.

And then there is the charming Dendrochilum convallariiforme. The flowers of the inflorescence are arranged in a spiral configuration, difficult to capture in a two-dimensional photo. Each spike is only about 2"long — this is definitely a miniature. It doesn't take up much space in the greenhouse.
