(Roberta's house, NOT the Library)

## Tour of Growing Areas, Good Company, and Show-and-Tell

Since our April meeting date falls on Easter this year and the library will be closed, we are meeting at the home of Roberta Fox. You'll have plenty of time to explore the outdoor and greenhouse growing areas, have a snack (bring your favorite), and socialize. There have been some changes since two years ago! Then, we'll have our usual show-and-tell session. So, bring your blooming species orchids! There will be plenty of room to display them. The address is:

#### 1854 Kentucky Pl. Costa Mesa

From the 405 Freeway, get off at Harbor and go south. Turn west (right turn) on Gisler, the first street south of the freeway. Landmark is In-n-Out Burger. Continue west on Gisler past two stop signs. After the second one, look for a yellow sign that says "Road Narrows". This is Washington (street sign is small, the "Road Narrows" sign is easier to see). Turn right on Washington, left on Illinois (first left), follow the road as it curves to the right and becomes Indiana. Second right off Indiana is Kentucky Pl. Phone is 714-435-8015.



# **Speaker's Choice**

February Speaker Peter Lin chose Pleurothallis ornata (now classified as Stelis), grown by Roberta Fox. This plant is often referred to as Pths. schiedei, but according to Orchidwiz (and IOSPE and http://Pleurothallids.com as well), that name is actually a synonym for Stelis (Pleurothallis, Specklinia, Effusiella) villosa, which is quite different. (fuzzy, no fringes). The name "ornata" is Latin for "ornate" or "decorative", referring to the fringes. Those little white fringes flutter in the breeze, and send a "come hither" signal to insect pollinators.

This plant is native to many parts of Mexico, and also Guatemala and El Salvador. It grows at an altitude of 4500-7500 ft. (1500-2500 m). It favors cool, shady, humid conditions. Its growth habit lends itself to mounting, but when grown that way, needs daily watering (or even more in the warm summer months). The flowers open successively on each inflorescence over a period of several months, so spikes should not be cut until new ones emerge, when that it easier to determine which ones really are finished. The flowers have a musty





aroma, which is better characterized as "smelly" than "fragrant".

# **Editor's Potting Bench**

Our "show and tell" sessions are the highlight of our meetings. All of us love to share our successful efforts at meetings. Sometimes, though, we are SO successful that the plant is just too large to bring in. I received an email from Jan Hennessey with just that dilemma. She has a Dendrobium speciosum that she has had for number of years. She moved to Costa Mesa three years ago, and the plant has doubled in size. It's just too large to take anywhere. Well, that is a goal of our "virtual Show and Tell" on our website. You can see from the photo (next page) that the pot is not very large, particularly considering the size of the plant. Den. speciosum really doesn't like to have its roots disturbed, so it does very nicely outgrowing its pot, with roots pointing in every direction, including up. In Australia, they grow in the cracks of boulders. On a Web forum, I saw an entry in which an Australian referred to them as "rock lilies". I love it...

Speaking of plants too big to transport, you have all seen my photos of Sobrallia calliglossa. At a height of about

12 feet, it's not going anywhere. But it is in bloom again, and so when you come to my house for the April meeting, you'll get to see it in all its glory. Where its first bloom late last summer was one beautiful spike that produced one flower at a time over a period of almost two months, this time there are three spikes, each of which has two branches. So now, I have several flowers at a time. I'll have binoculars available for a good look.

I have finally gotten around to re-doing my website, which I have been wanting to do since I moved to my current house six years ago. I have much better photos, a much better growing area, and I have learned a lot about orchids since I created it about 12 years ago. There have been revisions, of course, but the way that it was organized made sense for a small collection in a small space, not the way that I think about it now. There comes a point where one must start from a blank screen and incorporate new knowledge in a coherent fashion.
