While reading about mounting plants with sphagnum moss, I came upon some information regarding a disease called Sporotrichosis which can result from handling sphagnum moss with open sores or cuts on the hands. Apparently this can be quite serious as the disease can attack the lungs, joints, and central nervous system. This was new information to me, so I thought I would share it.

Our May meeting will take place on Mother's Day at the home of Edie Gulrich. I saw Edie's new greenhouse right after it was assembled, and I can't wait to see it up and running!

Editor's Potting Bench

I totally enjoyed hosting the April meeting. Clearly all of us enjoy visiting the growing areas of other people there was a really good crowd. We try to describe the conditions under which we grow our orchids at our regular show-and-tell sessions, but there's nothing like seeing the actual areas. So for those who weren't able to make it to my place in April, I hope you'll be able to see Edie's in May.

Make sure you put the Orchid Digest Speakers Day on your calendar! I have been to several, and each has been a fantastic learning experience. It's a day to wallow in orchid information.

I have recently re-worked my own website, which you can visit at http://orchidcentral.org (you can also still get there from orchidcentral.net) Over the years, I have changed the way I view the criteria for my various growing areas, how I classify what grows where, and generally how I think about my collection. And besides, the photos that I have taken in the last three or four years are much, much better than the earlier ones since cameras have improved so drastically. I'd look at the scanned prints, or even the 1-megapixel early digital ones, and say "Ick". So, it only took about six years since I moved from condo to house to get around

to the job, but I think you'll like the result.

I have shown my Masdevallia porphyrea at March and April meetings, and it is still in bloom (having had four spikes, each of which opened the flowers over several weeks) To properly appreciate the beauty of the flowers, it helps to get REALLY close, though. So here is a photo to make it easier. Another one that is hard to appreciate from a distance is Gastorchilus fuscopunctatus. First, it is a small plant. Leaves are about 1/2 to 3/4 inch, and have dark spots. The flowers are small (about 1/4 inch) but more frustratingly, they hide under the foliage. So one must look carefully to not miss the blooms alto-

gether. But it's very cute. and intricate. The lip is a pouch. (The prefix "Gastro-" refers to "stomach") Both of these plants grow outside, in the shade. The Masdevallia is in a clay pot, and the Gastrochilus is mounted.
