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

Bulbophyllums

Fred Clarke

What an amazing group of orchids! though not widely popular, this group deserves some notice. They make good companion plants with Phalaenopsis and Paphiopedilums. They grow fast and the hybrids are outstanding. Want to try something different? Here they are.

Fred Clarke has been growing orchids for 30 years and has been hybridizing for 22 of those years. With over 24 years as a professional grower and manager in the



He is a passionate orchid grower whose curiosity in orchids is broad and varied. Although developing Cattleya hybrids has been his sustaining interest, he is also

> actively creating new Bulbophyllum and Paphiopedilum hybrids plus some others to be named if they work out!

> His pioneering work in Catasetum intergeneric hybrids led to the development of several notable hybrids, most recently the grex. Fredclarkeara After Dark, which produced "the closest flower color to black ever witnessed". This grex received seven FCC's and three AM's on the first flowers shown for judging.

Fred is an Accredited Judge in the Pacific South Region. His plants have received hundreds of quality awards from the American Orchid Society. Bulbophyllum Michael Wright (dearei x carunculatum)



Speaker's Choice

January speaker Theresa Hill selected Cyrtorchis praetermissa, grown by Daniel Geiger, as her choice, drawn by its intoxicating fragrance. Daniel grows this Angraecoid species in an intermediate greenhouse,. It gets "cattleya light", some direct sun in morning and evening, but overhead it is protected by 50% shade cloth. Relative humidity is 70-80%.

According to Charles Baker (in *Orchidwiz*), Cyrtorchis praetermissa is found in a wide area across central Africa (including Angola, Namibia, Kenya, Tanzania, Zimbabwe, and areas between these countries). It occurs in woodlands in an altitude range of about 1500-6100 ft. (450-1800 m) The temperature range is given as 98—36 deg. F. Therefore, this plant should probably be able to adapt to outdoor conditions

in the more temperate parts of southern California, but can clearly be quite content to grow well in a warmer, more even temperature that it receives in the greenhouse. In nature, it experiences a relatively dry, bright winter but would still receive moisture from dew.

Editor's Potting Bench

While the rest of the country is still in the throes of winter, we are headed into spring show season. The Events page is full—shows and auctions non-stop for the next two months. Just in case you need more orchids (does that describe any of us???) there are lots of opportunities to acquire. The first show on the list, and the closest, is the Newport Harbor Orchid Expo at the Westminster Mall. As others have noted, Southern California Orchid Species Society will have a display. Some of our best plants will be there instead of on the Show and Tell table so be sure to visit. A couple of weeks after that, you'll find me at the Pacific Orchid Exposition in San Francisco—I am already drooling over the species-heavy vendor list for that one.

With Orchid Expo coming up, this is nail-biting time for those of us who want to put plants in our display. If it is bloom now (being written a week and a half before setup) will it still be nice at show time? If it is in bud, will it bloom in time? Being a bit of an optimist, I will share here some of the plants that are very likely to be in Westminster and not at the meeting. I have very high hopes for Laelia (Schomburgkia) moyobambae. The flowers have heavy, waxy substance and tend to have good lasting power. It has been tantalizing me for months. The recent rain facilitated the opening of buds,

washing away the sticky sap that was holding them closed. The genus Schomburgkia no longer is recognized, with all of the plants assigned either to Laelia or Myrmecophila. Pseudobulbs are distinctly different, but both have "heads' of many flowers with rippled petals on long spikes.

Not so certain to last two weeks, Cattleya percivaliana is just opening in the greenhouse. I really do hope that it will, because it is so spectacular., it deserves a wider audience.
