# Laelia Anceps: Varieties, and Their Influence on Hybrids

Curtis Gean is a semi-retired photographer/videographer current living in Sanger, CA (about 15 miles east of Fresno, on the way to Sequoia-Kings Canyon National Parks). His interest in Orchids developed in the '60's and guickly became an un-dying passion; this year marks his 43rd year of "Orchiditis". He became an accredited AOS judge in 1986, having served his "apprenticeship" commuting from Fresno to the San Francisco area even through the gas shortages of the '70's .

Approximately 17 years ago he went to visit some friends that he had made in Colima, Mexico while on a video assignment from the previous year. What was to be

a 2 week visit turned into 2 months... he then realized that he had found a new home, and eventually stayed there for the better part of the next 10 years. He found that living among naturally-occurring tropical Orchids is something that can only be experienced. He began searching the areas surrounding his location, and was able to find quite a number of species within the States of Colima, Jalisco, and Michoacan on the Pacific Coast, as well as a bit inland. He returned to the States in 2006, and now spends time between both locations... not as much as he would prefer in Mexico.

Last year Curtis spoke to us about the native California orchids that he has found in the Sierras. He is also an active orchid hybridizer. This month he will discuss the

varieties of Laelia anceps. Most of us are familiar with a few of the varieties, such as L. anceps var. guerrero or L. anceps var. veitchieana. However, there are many more named varieties and forms. Those unique colors and patterns are part of the hybridizer's "tool box".

## **Speaker's Choice**

January speaker Nico Goossens selected Mediocalcar decoratum, grown by Nancy Benay, as his Speaker's Choice. Nancy grows this plant in the greenhouse. She was out of town for a period of time, came back to find the plant in bloom with many little"candy corn" flowers.

Mediocalcar decoratum is native to New Gunea. It grows at a wide range of elevations, from around 2800-6700 ft., and has been observed as high as 8200 ft. This would indicate that it can grow under rather cool conditions. (Ed. note: I grow it outside, but mine doesn't look as good as Nancy's) The Baker culture sheet in Orchidwiz indicates a

temperature range in its native habitat of 84 deg. F down to 40 deg. F. It prefers rather shady conditions, and high humidity. Its growth habit is to form a "mat", and so needs to be grown in a shallow pot, basket or mounted, though it may be a challenge to keep a mounted plant moist enough.

# **Editor's Potting Bench**

After a couple of months with a paucity of orchidacquiring events, February always kicks off show season in a big way. Take a look at the Events page.. it is STUFFED. I had to resort to some "squeezing" tricks to get all of the entries on the page. Do check the SCOSS website Events page to view the posters with additional information about each event. And be sure to mark your calendar for Orchid Digest Speakers Day on June 14. Details will be available in the next issue of OD, but in the meantime, save the date.

Last year, the mail-order supplier Charley's Greenhouse had a seminar on greenhouse design and issues at their store in the state of Washington. I would have loved to attend, but of course it is about 1500 miles outside of commuting range. I asked, and I am sure many others did as well, if a video of the session might be available. It didn't happen right away (they could have sold a lot of DVDs if it had) but it is now available as a series of YouTube videos. Even better, since a DVD would cost, and this is free. Go to http://www.charleysgreenhouse.com/index.cfm?page =\_greenhouse-101 for a page of links to the videos. If you don't have a greenhouse and are thinking of getting one, there is a wealth of valuable information and things to consider. Even if you already have one, there are some excellent ideas that you can use to improve it. It's about an hour and a half of viewing (the actual length of their class) but broken into a separate segment for each topic. A hint-the default view is tiny, but you can choose to view it in full screen.

We will be setting up our display at the Westminster Mall on the morning of Thursday, February 6. If you have blooming species orchids, bring them to the society display room (same location as last year, I think) by 10 AM, or contact Yolanda if you need another way to get the plants to the mall. If you can be there to help, even better.

I am at the stage of talking to my plants, urging them to bloom... but not too soon. There are so many candidates. This is turning out to be a wonderful winter for orchid-blooming. (I love you, California!!!) So, let me share a few orchids that will probably not make it to the meeting... either because they're up in Westminster in our display (hope, hope) or sadly past their prime.

This Laelia anceps was purchased at the Westminster show about 4 years ago, a two-bulb division still in bloom (so it can be assumed to have bloomed around the beginning of February) Since then it has bloomed each year but at different times — in October, late December, and November... finally it seems to have come full circle, blooming at about the same time as the year that I got it.

Laelia (Schomburgkia) moyobambae has been teasing me for months, with the spike continuing to elongate but no sign of blooming. Suddenly, as I write this, it is just starting to open, so I'm hoping that it will be at its prime for the show. This plant grows outside—it would probably prefer to be a bit warmer, but it has adapted.

This Odontoglossum cristatum was purchased at our auction last fall, so one of my more recent acquisitions. At that time it had one spike, just finishing. It must have liked my patio, though, because it recently exploded with multiple spikes, and much fuller flowers than that original one.

Cymbidium canaliculatum is a long shot... it's either going to just barely open in time, or just miss it (in which case it might make the meeting) But with three spikes, the most that it has ever done, I hope...

And then there's "old reliable", Pterostylis curta. It will certainly be in the show, but it may or may not be in full glory. Still a bit sparse, but those spikes develop very rapidly. We'll see...
